Conradh na Gaeilge has developed a mobile exhibition based on historical documents and pictures in Conradh na Gaeilge's collection.

The exhibition details the role the Irish Language movement played in the broad Irish revival period from the late nineteenth century to the period of revolution in the early twentieth century with the primary focus on the 1916 Easter Rising. It highlights both the context and various aspects of the revival and also focuses on the lives of leading members of Conradh na Gaeilge and their roles in the Easter Rising.
