## A one-day introductory workshop on Path Analysis

This will be a one-day course that introduces attendees to path analysis. This event will aim to outline the theory of the technique, introduce the software (AMOS will be used) and allow hands-on experience of modelling data to allow attendees to use these techniques on their own research projects or CRN data sets. No experience of path analysis will be required although it would be beneficial if attendees have a basic understanding of correlations or regression models.

This workshop aims to support research skills development and provide opportunities for networking (and potential collaboration) between attendees. The workshop will be provided by Dr Donncha Hanna and Dr Liam O'Hare from Queen's University Belfast.
